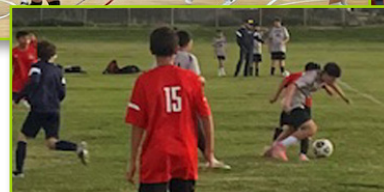

We were also able to purchase new uniforms for boys and girls soccer teams and boys basketball



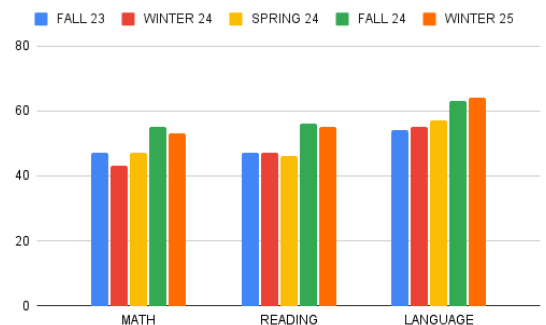

State of the School Elementary Report 2026 (24-25 school year)

Learning Spotlight

- **Honor Roll** - 95% of our 3rd-5th Grade Students earned 3.0-3.5 GPA Honor Roll or High Honor Roll (3.5 GPA or higher) during all four quarters of the 24-25 School year.
- **Achievement** - MAP Scores-See chart for comparison from 23/24 to 24/25 school year averages.→ We continue on a steady incline across all academic areas.
- **NEW IM Math Curriculum**-We purchased a new math curriculum as a part of our 2024 Math Articulation Plan, and we have seen a huge improvement in our students' math scores, as evidenced in their MAP Scores. Over 10% growth within the first quarter of the school year!
- **Reflex**-Our students began a Math Fluency Program called Reflex. We have seen tremendous gains in our students' Math Fact Fluency!
- **IXL**-Reading Monthly Challenge Competitions to encourage students to read and improve their reading comprehension.



NEW Facilities

The move to the new campus alleviated some pressure on school schedules and provided adequate space. We can now offer combined lunches and chapels. We have a designated space for Music, Library, and Art classes, and a multi-purpose room for chapel, cafeteria, and before and after-school care facilities.

Extracurricular Academic Opportunities

- **Scripps Spelling Bee**-Our 4th-5th grade students competed in the Merced County Scripps Regional Spelling Bee. This was our first year participating in this competition.
 - Esther Nguyen (5th grade) earned 3rd place out of 16 spellers at the Merced County Scripps Regional Spelling Bee!
- **MCOE Father of the Year Essay Contest**-Our students participated in a Father of the Year essay contest. Two of our students earned 1st place for their essays. 1 student earned 2nd place and 1 student earned 3rd place.



School Climate Spotlight

- We continue to focus on developing Christ-like character in our students.
 - Fruits of the Spirit focus in our chapels.



- Character Recognition Program - “Legacy Leaders”
 - Students are recognized for helping others, showing kindness, displaying good manners, and helping keep our campus clean.

- 5th Grade Leadership Program-encourages students to serve on campus, like Cafeteria Clean up and Car Patrol after school. Students are also paired with a Kindergarten Buddy to mentor for the year.
- Kindergarten students were paired with a senior buddy for the first time this year. This included several art projects done together throughout the year, as well as seniors walking their kindergarten buddies into their graduation ceremony. Such a special moment!



Giving Back to Our Community

- SRC Elementary continues to sponsor and support a student, Maruth Namatovu, and her school in Uganda, Shared Love Junior School. Students created a sponsorship poster for the school office and raised over \$700 through student offerings in chapel and a snack bar, which our 5th-grade students operate during morning recess. We were honored to have the school's founder, Moses Sebagala, and his wife Naomi come to speak with our students in a special assembly to give an update on how the school is doing and how SRC is blessing them!
- Our Fourth Grade students held a Turkey Drive at Thanksgiving to collect Turkeys and canned food items for local shelters for their annual service project.



- Our Third Grade students collected and filled 50 Boxes for Operation Christmas Child for their annual service project.
- Our Second Grade students created Blessing Bags for the homeless to donate to Merced Rescue Mission for their annual service project.

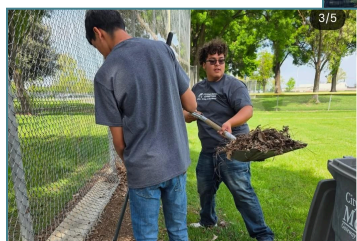

HISTORY

San Joaquin Valley Christian School Association, a non-profit corporation, was organized on October 1, 1999 for the purpose of establishing a Christian high school in the community of Merced, California. Stone Ridge Christian High School opened in August, 2001. In 2016 SRC merged with Providence Christian to create a PreK-12 grade school. In 2018 the Middle and High School moved to a new location on Dan Ward Road. In 2024, the Elementary School moved to the Dan Ward campus, bringing all grades to one location.
